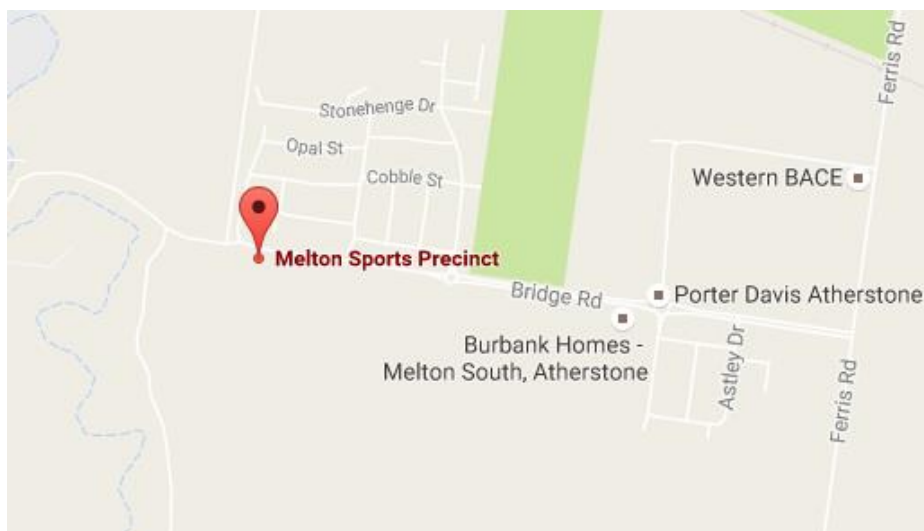

3. President's Report

a. On-Field Success:

It was fantastic that we were able to complete our first full season in three years and even better that our Under 14s and Under 12s both made it to their respective grand finals – a first for our juniors! We also had two of our senior teams make it through their finals series as well. Our Under 14s won our very first Junior Premiership after having to postpone their Grand Final due to a lighting issue on the night.

Our total membership for 2022 was 106 members and this included 41 new members for the club. We entered 3 senior teams and five junior teams into the Hockey Victoria Winter Competition.

Our senior teams were all very successful. Our Men's Metro A team finished third on the ladder after winning 6 of the 15 games they played this season making it through to the elimination final. Our Men's Metro B team finished eighth on the ladder after winning 6 of the 18 games they played this season. This was a great result with many of our Under 16 boys making their senior hockey debut in this team.

Our Women's Metro team finished fourth on the ladder after beginning the season with limited players, making it through to the preliminary finals only to lose to Altona. They won 11 out of the 18 games they played. This team also featured several junior girls making their senior hockey debut this season.

We had 50 junior players represent our club across five teams (under 16, under 14, under 12 and two half field under 10 teams). We continued to increase our junior numbers from the 2021 season. With plans to introduce an under 10s localised Hockey 5s competition in 2023 we look forward to growing the number of our juniors' again next season.

This year also saw five of our junior players make it into the Zone Representative teams that competed at the Junior State Championships in July.

Thank you also to all our parents, without your support in getting your children to training and games we could not field all our teams. Thank you to all the parents who supported us with our efforts to run our BBQs during the year at our junior games.

To all the players that wore our uniform in 2022 and represented our club, thank you and well done. After the last two years of interrupted seasons, it was great to see the smiles and passion

for our great game back. To see the improvement from our players since 2021 was a huge highlight and I can't wait to see what 2023 holds.

Thank you to all our coaches, team managers and umpires for their tireless efforts this year. Without dedicated people in these roles our teams cannot operate. Well done.

b. Off-Field Success:

Thank you to all our sponsors. Our club is fortunate to have these businesses willing to support us and this support trickles down to every team and player in the form of keeping costs low and purchasing uniform and equipment. Thank you to all our sponsors in 2022, we look forward to working with you all again in 2023.

I would like to express my thanks to the Committee for their efforts and support throughout the year. Our committee continues to volunteer their time to ensure that all members are able to get onto the field each week for games and training.

I would especially like to thank Leanne Wright. Leanne has taken on the role of secretary this year and she has also worked tirelessly to get our canteen up and running again after our Covid interrupted seasons. Without her work behind the scenes, we would not have been able to offer this facility to all members or supporters this season.

We will certainly enter our 2023 season with plenty of promise of bigger things to come.

- Applied for and awaiting in gaining a further 1 State Government Grants totaling \$2000 to assist the club to survive for a further 12 months
- Attended with Kathy, two meetings with Hockey Victoria via Zoom outlining club requirements for 2022 and beyond
- Umpired teams wherever possible to assist game day competition, whether it be juniors or seniors
- Sorted out men's teams issues as they arose to keep everyone focused
- Brought player records up to date and they now listed on our club web site
- To begin to plan the transition of some of our junior players into senior hockey for season 2023
- To establish an intra club summer competition (Hockey 5's) for November/December to retain interest in and to generate new players for the upcoming 2023 season hockey
- Organised and purchased equipment, manager kits along with First Aid kits for all teams

This year has been hard on all of us, even more so being the 3rd year of Covid. The board members have worked hard to maintain our club's viability but there is a need for other members to assist. I would like to thank Kathy especially for the work she has carried out in the first half of the year. She has been under enormous pressures at times, but she has always put our club's welfare first. Together we have had to make some difficult decisions which in retrospect have turned out to be correct. I see our club making further gains over the next few years. The one pleasing factor is that our playing numbers are back to pre-covid numbers.

6. Coach Coordinator Report

Women: The women struggled throughout the year with a shortage of players. Great work by Kathy, Vi and Fran kept the team above board for each week of the season. The introduction of juniors assisted the team immensely. The team finished in the top 4 at the end of the season which was brilliant. Many new players starting to play and hopefully will be available in 2023. The key to the team was the acceptance of all and the continual praise to new and junior players. To attract former players back, the team may need to go to a low pennant competition in 2023. Many thanks to Brad for coaching and Fran for being captain.

Men: The men were able to field 2 teams for the 2022 season. It was sad the VL3 team was withdrawn after making demands of the club that were unreasonable. The loss of these players made it tough for the remaining players to run 2 teams for the year. To the credit of the men and Matt Wright, 2 teams did compete with Metro 1 making finals. The introduction of Juniors made a big difference. Men's playing numbers are slowly rebuilding and with new juniors wishing to play Seniors next year, 2 teams will be much easier to handle.
